SIOP Training

The SIOP Model - Working Effectively and Efficiently with English Learners

The Sheltered Instruction Observation Training (SIOP) Model remains one of the few research-based interventions designed to assist mainstream classroom teachers in working with English learners. This sheltered language approach helps English learners make academic progress in content-area subjects while also acquiring and strengthening their skills toward greater English language proficiency. The SIOP Model's eight components include lesson preparation and instructional indicators such as comprehensible input and the building of back-ground knowledge to aid in the organization and delivery of effective instruction. The presenter will integrate these eight SIOP components into practical, hands-on activities to help content teachers and the English learners in their classrooms.

Participants will:

- Recognize the predominant role of language in all classroom instruction
- Apply SIOP components to realistic classroom lessons
- Identify key elements of academic language and outline ways to practice it
- Work with team colleagues to outline a basic SIOP phase-in plan



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Presenter:

Dennis Terdy has been a frequent national presenter and consultant in the field of English language learners for over 40 years, providing SIOP training to teachers across the US for the past ten years. Authoring one of the first sheltered ELL texts, *Content ESL: Social Studies*, his interest continues with making academic content accessible to all levels of student language proficiencies.
